

Some basic information about the ERASMUS+ programme:

It's the school, who asks for a grant (not an individual teacher anymore). The school needs to initiate a development project and can ask for a grant for several teachers to go abroad. The teacher development courses support the aims of the development project at school. You can ask for different courses for the teachers involved and the project can last either one or two years.

A possible title for a development project in your school, supported by our courses could be e.g.:

1. How to teach English motivating, communicative and student-centred. Engaging methods and techniques for teaching English as a foreign language.
2. How to engage students in English lessons. Finding a key by motivating them to avoid early school leaving.
3. Motivating methods for teaching English and preparing for CLIL.

Just to give you a couple of examples. You would have to think of what your needs at school are and how we in our course can contribute to the development (see information about our courses in the downloads).

In the application, you will have to describe the aims of the development project and how the teachers' learning increase will effect their school work.

It's good to have a couple of teachers who are in charge of this development project at school. So the course results can have a bigger impact on the school development.

At the time you apply for the grants, you don't need to tell the concrete names of the teachers, for whom you're asking for a grant to go abroad, just how many will be involved and what their role / function is in the development project.
